2022: News, Challenges and Events.

Dear IPSC Family,

Following the decision of the IOC, the IPSC Executive Council decided to impose the following sanctions:

- 1. The 2023 Action Air World Shoot scheduled for Sochi, Russia has been cancelled. This decision entered into force on February 28. 2022.
- 2. All future international matches (Level III and above) scheduled in Russia have been cancelled and have their sanctioning removed. This decision entered into force on February 28, 2022, and it is valid until further notice.
- 3. Neither athletes nor Range Officers from IPSC Russia and IPSC Belarus will be allowed to take part in any IPSC Level III to V matches. This decision entered into force on March 3, 2022, and it is valid until further notice.

Year 2021 In Numbers.

Despite the pandemic, over 400 IPSC matches were successfully conducted in 45 Regions and Presidents' medals were awarded to 2634 winners.

The indomitable spirit of the IPSC athlete, Range Officers, Trainiers and Instructors never fluctuated and our sport kept going while observing all the mandated COVID-19 protocols to ensure everbody's safety on the range.

To all of you, my deepest gratitude and immense congratulations!

International Practical Shooting Confederation is a full Member of AIMS!



IPSC was granted **Full Member of GAISF** and **AIMS** status, and became a **WADA Code Signatory**. As of today, there are two fully recognized Independent International Shooting Sports Organizations in the world - ISSF and IPSC.

What the GAISF recognition means for IPSC?

IPSC Regions now have a legal standing to seek official government recognition from national sports authorities like Ministries of Sports, Sports Departments or National Olimpic Committees. IPSC is now considered within the Region like any other recognised sport and it should be supported by its local government.

The Regional IPSC organization would now have the right to put forward proposals for a change in firearm legislation that would in turn protect IPSC athletes from restrictions on civilian firearm ownership and the current disadvantages they face when participating in international competitions - a clear example is the magazine capacity limit.

Now all our IPSC athletes are protected as owners of SPORTING firearms. Regional organizations have legal grounds to list IPSC firearms on the Official Sporting Firearms Register or to initiate the

creation of such registry. The grounds for this are the IPSC Rules and the Production Division List.

2021 IPSC General Assembly

The first ever online IPSC General Assembly was successfully conducted in December 2021. I was very pleased with the participation of our esteemed Regional Directors and I would like to take this opportunity to thank them all for their participation and unwavering support.

In 2022, we will continue to work together with the Regions to develop our beloved Sport.

IPSC Partners and Sponsors

IPSC Partners confirmed the benefits from the collaboration and confirmed their intentions to continue supporting IPSC via renewed partnership agreements for 2022.

REGIONAL REPORT





Practical Pistol Shooting was introduced to Sri Lanka in 1978 by the son of Late President of Sri Lanka HE JR Jayawardene, who was elected as the first Executive President of Sri Lanka in 1977. His son, late Ravi Jayawardene who was involved in the Sport of Practical Pistol Shooting from its inception in Perth, Australia, where he was residing at that time, introduced this popular Sport to the Police & Armed Forces of Sri Lanka in 1978.

The first ever overseas tour of IPSC Sri Lanka took place in 1990 where the Sri Lanka team participated at the Western Australian Handgun Titles in Geelong in 1990. Thereafter, in 1990, IPSC Sri Lanka as Region was established and duly affiliated to the Confederation, to enable Sri Lankan Shooters to participate in International Competitions, through the National Rifle Association (NRA) being the Governing Body for Shooting in Sri Lanka.

Since 1990, National Handgun & 3-Gun Teams, selected by the NRA Selection Committee and

approved by the Ministry of Sports have been representing Sri Lanka successfully in several IPSC Level III, IV & V Championships in USA, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia etc, winning numerous International medals and trophies, including the Junior Team Bronze Medals at the World Shoot held in Florida, USA, in 2014, being the crowning glory of IPSC Sri Lanka, at the highest International Level, in addition to winning the Level III & IV Championships held in Singapore & New Zealand, respectively.

A landmark event that must be placed on record was the historic Level III International IPSC Championship that was conducted in Sri Lanka in 2003, despite a Resolution passed at the Sydney Olympics in 2000, alienating the Sport of IPSC from Olympic disciplines. The Mega Event was fully sponsored by generous sponsors.

In spite of all these challenges, IPSC is still a popular shooting sport in Sri Lanka with over 200 active

members competing in Handgun and Shotgun events. It is heartening to note that there are over 150 civilian gun owners including ladies and juniors with imported guns exclusively for IPSC and taking in the years to come and would like to extend part in the sport. In the whole of South Asia, Sri Lanka is the only country that has recognized IPSC as a shooting sport by the Ministry of Sports to date and conducting IPSC matches as per criteria laid in the latest rule book. Sri Lanka has the potential to popularize IPSC in the entire South Asia if the support is forthcoming from the world body.



Being a tropical country, we are fortunate to conduct matches throughout the year except for the rainy season which is barely two months of the year. We have two gazette military ranges in Colombo and hill country garrison city of Diyathalawa. Also we conduct IPSC events in two other picturesque hill stations in Kandy and Nuwara-Eliya manned by civilian clubs.

In addition to three defence services and police, there are 11 civilian clubs engaged in IPSC shooting. All these clubs are affiliated to the National Rifle Association (NRA) presided by a two star general on rotation basis among the three services. The NRA is the governing body of all non-Olympic shooting disciplines in Sri Lanka and is coming under both Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Sports.

IPSC Sri Lanka has one IROA Range Master, one CRO and four ROs who are actively officiating international events with distinction globally.

Presently, IPSC Sri Lanka is striving hard to resurrect the Sport of Practical Shooting in order to achieve continued international accolades a warm invitation to all international competitors to visit Sri Lanka and enjoy the traditional Sri Lankan hospitality!

IPSC Sri Lanka By The Numbers

How many members does your Region have?

We have over 200 active members competing in Handgun and Shotgun events.

How many Levels 1-2-3 matches you conduct per year?

For the 2022 year we expect to conduct over 120 Level 1 matches, three Level 2 matches and one Level 3 match.

How many gun clubs are there in your Region?

In Sri Lanka, we have about 11 civilian clubs.

How many ROs, MISIA (IPSC) Instructors and Trainers reside in your Region?

IPSC Sri Lanka has one IROA Range Master, one CRO and four ROs who are actively officiating international events with distinction globally.




Mikael "St.Michael" Schelén Team KAHLES

I come from a martial arts and fighting sports background and started shooting IPSC in 2013. I had a lot of perks coming from another sport that required focus, co-ordination, balance and a competitor mindset.

As much as I enjoy shooting handgun and shotgun... I have always been a "rifle guy" and started shooting rifles as soon as I could after receiving my IPSC license.

In 2015 I was one of the founding members of The Top Gun Rifle Team who have been my "shooting family" since then and 2018 I joined the KAHLES Team along with TGRT member Olle Ackehed. Shooting has taken us on amazing adventures around the world... from the grassy plains of



Mongolia to the red dust of South Africa. We have met the most amazing people in the shooting community and found friendships that will last us a lifetime.

During the pandemic a lot of matches were cancelled but the team and I went to all the matches we still could. The day after the first travel ban was lifted, I took off to partake in a Level 3 PCC match in Poland. We have since shot as many matches in Europe as possible... and there were more than a few! I won three Swedish Championship titles during 2021 and was awarded the title "Rifle Master" in Steel Challenge.



With the "extra time" in my hands with less matches and a low "pandemic season" working as a full time tattoo artist I decided to start another business that had been in the back of my mind for a long time.

I teamed up with Andreas Warsén and we started The Armoury Sports. (Now joined by Mats Lisstrand and my brother Stefan Nordh)

The Armoury Sports is the gun store and one stop shop we allways dreamed about. Customers come to the store for knowledge, service and a full stocked armoury.

We offer firearms, optics, (a full range of KAHLES of course) parts, repairs/modifications and tuning. We also have a workshop in the store where customers can see how we work on their firearms, mounting optics or building custom race guns.

For 2022, we all hope matches are coming back and on top of the Swedish Championships and The Nordic Championships in rifle and PCC, we have also signed up for matches in the USA, Lithuania, Estonia, Poland, Czech Republic and more... and we are all excited and will be ramping up for the next Rifle World Shoot held in beautiful Finland.

I shoot a 18" ZEV "The Armoury Edition" .223 wylde rifle with a Proof Research Barrel and Te-Titan compensator. The rifle has a lot of keybingredients from Finnish innovator Hannu Uronen and is topped with a KAHLES K18i 1-8x24 in a Spuhr mount and sitting next to it is a KAHLES Helia Red Dot as my secondary Optic. The tall glass of the Helia Red Dot makes it perfect for IPSC and steel challenge as it allows super quick red dot acquisiton.

In my mind it's hands down best combo for IPSC Rifle! Another KAHLES product that I trust and would never go to a match without packing in my bag is my KAHLES Helia RF rangefinder. It came in handy during the Vortex Cup in Poland where we had ranges between 3-420m.


But most of all... thank you to my family who let me follow my passion, travel the world and experience all that shooting sports and IPSC have given me. It has truly made me a better person!



YOUNG GUNS



How did you first hear about IPSC?

I started by watching YouTube videos on IDPA and quickly found out about IPSC. So, I took a basic IPSC course at the Grandmaster Shooting Academy Thailand and then attended my first IPSC match at the THPSA Shooting Range in Production Division. I got my first Production Junior Award and since then I've been active in the sport.

For how long have you been shooting?

I started shooting IDPA when I was 12 and then transitioned to IPSC at 13.

What division do you shoot and why?

I shoot Production Division. The 9mm pistol is great for beginning shooting IPSC because I don't have to pay too much attention on equipment and the price is reasonable. I think we should focus on the shooting discipline first and the equipment modification should come second. Production Division is also very fun to shoot, with so many people shooting in this Division it represents a challenge for me to get better and better every day.





What is the coolest about IPSC shooting?

IPSC is the action shooting sport which has Speed, Power and Accuracy as DVC motto. It's exciting and each stage design offers great variety at both local and international matches. I also love meeting many new friends at every match. Finally, it's a very cool sport itself, with the equipment and apparel we use it is very colorful and vibrant.

What do your friends and family think about you shooting IPSC?

My family think it's a very interesting sport and they fully support me in every single way. My friends also think this sport is really cool.

What other sports or activities you enjoy besides IPSC shooting?

I play soccer as a member of my school's team. In addition, I love playing the guitar.

What are the biggest challenges you have when shooting IPSC?

My hometown Korat is about 260 km away from Bangkok City and there are not many IPSC athletes around me. This issue forces me to practice alone and sometimes I struggle with getting advice. Time management is also another consideration I need to take care when I travel to matches (my mom ofter drives me 4-5 hours one way to attend a match).

How many years have you been shooting?

I have been shooting since 2013.

What do you like best about IPSC shooting?

I look up to Miroslav Zapletal, he inspired me very much in the past and I always learn something new. Recently, I have completed some training with Ben Stoeger and I have to say I am impresed with his method of teaching.

What is your match pistol and ammo?

My match pistol is custom made in Wroclaw, Poland by Gunworks.pl, and it is called the WIS 1911SS.

My match ammo is Limit IPSC.

How do you unwind at the end of the day?

I love shooting and the sport is what really makes me relax and feel great.

How do you prepare mentally for a match?

I try to have little to no expectations about my performace compared to other competitors... it really helps me to focus on my shooting without getting caught up on things that cloud my mind. I also try to be "right here, right now".

Any special exercises?

I do engage with a personal trainer that focuses on movement. In addition, I practice Krav Maga twice a week.

Do you dry fire or use an airsoft gun at home?

No, I don't since I have the chance to go to the range very often.

Are you active in any other sport?

Not right now, IPSC shooting is my main focus.

What advice do you have for up and coming shooters?

If you have the possibility, hire a professional IPSC trainer: this is definitely a big advantage that will help you hone your skills and find out what needs improvement. I can guarantee you, it will save you time and money in the long run!

When and where did you first discover IPSC shooting?



I shoot Standard Division because I love the magazine loading advantage.


Who and/or what inspired you to begin IPSC shooting?

Also, just a friendly reminder that if there are any rules you don't agree with you must contact IROA, and they in turn will forward your inquiry to the proper committees.






