

#### IPSC celebrates 44 years since its foundation

Dear Friends,

May 24th marked the celebration of IPSC' 44 years of existence!

Those of us who were at the beginning of our sports development can see a difference, an amazing difference that happened during these vears in our sport.

I would like to thank everyone who was involved in the development of our Confederation and our beloved sport!

To really appreciate the extent of the revolution of IPSC, consider the handgun shooting scene in the 1960's. The only international handgun competition was at the Olympics and in the United States the NRA bullseye course was the accepted standard. The pistol of choice was a revolver. There were no moderately priced progressive reloaders, no electronic timers, and no race guns. There were few gun magazines, and none dedicated solely to handguns. Television and movie detectives carried snub-nosed revolvers and fired them one-handed from the hip.

A lot of lead has gone downrange since Cooper and his friends started slapping leather back in 1956 and today, the Confederation is truly an international sports shooting organization that has revolutionized handgun shooting on all levels.

Do you think it is hard work to develop IPSC? Maybe for some of us, but it is also a great pleasure because we have fun on the range, we have fun designing our stages, we have fun conducting our big interesting competitions, and we have fun creating and improving the rules of IPSC sport.



## **How are IPSC Regions Dealing** with COVID-19?

As the world deals with the COVID-19 Boštjan Pavlič - IPSC SLOVENIA pandemic, IPSC has also had to adjust the Match Calendar for 2020, 2021 and 2022 in regards to Level IV and V competitors.

We asked our Regional Directors how their Regions are dealing with COVID-19 and what planning is being put in place once restrictions are lifted.

#### Dr. Rupak Debroy - IPSC INDIA

The Indian Government has extended the lockdown until June 30th and we are not optimistic restrictions will get lifted anytime soon. These circumstances led to mass cancellations or postponement of national and international sporting events across the world – events such as the Indian Premier League (IPL) which are widely popular in India.

Here at the Indian Olympic Association (NOC-INDIA), we are closely following our government's restrictions and following the news from around the world. We wish all our IPSC family good health and good spirits!



We are one of the most successful countries in Europe in managing the situation with the Covid-19 virus. The epidemic was declared on March 12, 2020. Thus, competitions were not allowed, and there were also no trainings. At the end of April, the measures were partially reducted and we were able to start training. As of Monday, June 1, 2020, our activities continue, as the country declares the end of the epidemic. There are only some prohibitions and warnings in force, which do not interfere with our activities to a greater extent.

We hope, that there will be no more unpleasant experiences of this kind in the future and that we will be able to perform our favorite sport, IPSC practical shooting.

#### Stathis Kakogiannis - IPSC GREECE

Due to Covid-19, all matches have been canceled since March 8th, 2020. Training has been allowed again since May 5th, 2020 with the following procedures:

- a. Members must have a signed document from a doctor indicating that they have been examined and he has not any COVID-19 symptoms,
- b. During their entrance in the range, the member will have their temperature measured and all their data written down as well as entry and exit time,
- c. Members must keep at least two meters distance between them,
- d. Spectators (friends, family) are not allowed to enter the range and,
- e. All range officials must wear protective face mask.

Matches of any level are not allowed yet. Hopefully they should begin during June.

The IPSC local committee meets online every week. We have decided to postpone the Greek championships LIIs and LIIIs until next year, the same was decided for the Meditteranean Extreme Open (Rhodes) and Canal Challenge(Korinth). We believe that this year we will organize mostly LIs and LIIs.

Wish everyone to be safe and meet again soon.

#### Spasoje Vulevic - IPSC SERBIA

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic in Serbia, we postponed the competitions until the end of May and fortunately we managed to successfully organize and conduct the first match after pandemic on May 24th. We will continue further competitions in compliance with all procedures for the protection of competitors based on the recommendations of the Government of Serbia.



#### Christian Gallardo - IPSC GUATEMALA

In Guatemala, we were quite affected by the issue of Covid-19, but we have continued to train online using Zoom every day, and seminars have been held to avoid

losing the habit of IPSC. We have invited professional shooters like Jorge Ballesteros, Gorka Ibáñez, Galo Moreira and Estuardo Gomez to these online sessions and the experience has been great so far.

#### Jeremy Batsaikhan - IPSC MONGOLIA

Due to the Covid-19, Mongolia has been under guarantine since the 27th of January. Recently, the Mongolian government has extended the quarantine until the end of this month and there is a higher possibility to extend one or two more months.

As you know Mongolia is located right in the middle of China and Russia, both countries are top countries with Covid-19 situation. During the quarantine period IPSC Mongolia can't hold any training, match or conduct any meeting with more than 5 people at a time. We have no immediate plans to organize any matches in the near future, not at least until the end of September, 2020.

Basically we are fixing, improving, redesigning our ranges and targeting as well as other necessary things before we open our ranges to shooters.

#### Demetrius da Silva Oliveira - IPSC **BRASIL**

Since the beginning of the pandemic and the progress of the situation that would show that this could affect our activities, CBTP met with the entire board to assess the effects of the COVID19 pandemic on its events, deciding to suspend its competitions indefinitely. On the

other hand, to inform our athletes about the progress of the situation in Brazil, we formulated a CBTP Covid Bulletin19, daily reports containing the decrees that determined the closure of the establishments, with the objective of promoting social distancing and avoiding the crowding of people.

We hold meetings by videoconference for the prevention and protection of our employees, aiming at the elaboration of new calendars with possible returns, respecting all the prevention rules stipulated by the health agencies and the fight against COVID19.

Our goal is protecting the health of all our athletes, employees, ROs, organizers and the public present, so that CBTP events will return and be the real success of before.

#### Mikhail Gushchin - IPSC RUSSIA

Currently in most of the regions in Russia the matches are suspended until further notice, although in some regions there is a possibility to train following safety recommendations.

Members of the national team mostly keep training and employees of IPSC Russia continue to work remotely.

#### Jetsada Phae-Araya (Tony) - IPSC **THAILAND**




COVID-19 has affected all the match calendar in Thailand completely from March to early June, 2020. The government has forbidden to have crowded gathering sport events during the lockdown. So far during the early days of June, mour local infection has been 0 for 10 straight days.

The government has eased the lockdown now by allowing practicing with less than 8 people in 1 group, so we are conducting informal training with 8 people per Squad.

We expect to resume all schedule by early July.

#### Joon-ki Kim - IPSC KOREA



All members of IPSC Korea are committed to following the guidelines and recommendations of the Korean C.D.C.

According to these criteria against Covid-19, every attendee will be required to check body temperature before they enter the training facility and for the presence of respiratory illness symptoms as well as members and/or participants. At the same time, we have to keep records of all visitors to our training center.

We have been successful on following these guidelines and have been conducting training sessions as well as domestic competitions cautiously.

#### **Kevin Grant - IPSC BARBADOS**

Covid-19 arrived in Barbados in March and gave great scare to society as various regions were seriously impacted by this pandemic, with high rates of infection and even deaths. We currently have 92 confirmed cases with 7 deaths and 81 recoveries. While the numbers may seem small, it negatively affected our economy as we are a small island 166 square miles.

Our borders are slowly reopening, and the curfew has been eased allowing for certain sporting activities to commence. At present, 2 of our ranges are open for business but certain protocols have to be undertaken in order to maintain operations. The government states that only 2 persons are allowed on the firing line at any given time and no spectators are allowed. This would be the range officer and the competitor.

Constant sanitizing has to be done and minimum physical contact adhered to. We will probably use a waiting area where persons can wait prior to their turn on the range. Physical distancing must be maintained and masks worn at this point. The plan is to assign 2 patchers to a stage but have them away from the stage as the competitor runs through the course of fire. Once the stage is completed and the RO states the time and calls the scores the patchers will come onto the stage and the RO and competitor leave (based on the governmental protocol, the RO will have to key the scores to maintain the 2 person on the stage rule).

This process will be very time consuming but will allow for the safety of our IPSC members. This is if and when we do decide to reestablish IPSC matches, but for now there are no small matches upcoming. We currently have a level 3 scheduled for August, that will have to be postponed until later in the year.

Hopefully when we do start to host matches again, protocols would have reduced allowing us to better partake in the sport we love.



#### THE KAHLES K18i IPSC RETICLE

We at KAHLES share the passion and professionalism of ambitious shooters. We passionately support their aspiration to continually enhance performance. We do this with intuitive simple and smart products, based on profound user insight. This is why we have developed a reticle, especially for IPSC matches.

The KAHLES "IPSC" reticle has been designed together with some of the best IPSC shooters in the world, like Raine Peltokoski and Jarkko Laukia, both top shooters from Finland. We have asked Raine to explain the basic idea behind the simple reticle concept.





"In practical shooting the targets can be set on multiple different distances within a single stage. The distances can vary from below 10m to beyond 300m. The bullet does not travel straight and in long distances the drop of the bullet needs to be taken into account. This is normal for any long distance target shooting. What makes practical-rifle shooting difficult is that the speed aspect of the game does not allow sight adjustment between the targets. You must shoot all distances with one scope elevation setting.

There are two basic principles to handle the need for changing the aiming point on the targets: holding over and holding under. Holding over means the zero distance is closer (typically 100m) than the targets and for targets further away the aiming point is higher than the target. Holding under means the zero distance is further than (some of) the targets. Due to the targets being at the high part of the bullet trajectory the aiming point needs to be lower than those targets.

My personal principle behind Kahles IPSC reticle relies on a technique to dial the scope zero always to the longest target distance and holding under for the targets at the high part of the bullet trajectory. A big part of the holding under technique is the easiness at windy conditions for the longest targets because elevation is zeroed correct and only windage, sideways correction, needs to be taken into account. This is both fast and accurate.

The benefit of holding under is that you can have the illuminated dot on the target for most of the time. For closer targets you can easily find an aiming point on IPSC Classic target, just lower than it normally is. The magnification change does not have an effect on the illuminated dot position, which adds freedom on the stage plan compared to holding over technique.

Another big idea behind the KAHLES IPSC reticle is the openness of the view. No thick lines, nor multiple lines distracting vision and finding the next target. In fast shooting the targets are maximally visible and the dot placement is easy."

#### MAIN TECHNIQUES

The following examples shall illustrate different strategies how to use the IPSC reticle. The graphs we use are based on the STRELOK PRO App, using the data from Raines weapon system.

Data used for calculations: Caliber:

Bullet: Lapua FMJ Bullet weight: 55 grs Bullet speed: 912 m/s

Zero distance: 100 meters or longest target

#### **TECHNIQUE 1**

Raine Peltokoski always dials zero on the longest target distance and holding under for the targets at the high part of the bullet


Target 1: 300 meters 100 meters Target 2:

300 meters & 4 m/s wind from 90° right Target 3:

In that example Raine would dial to 300 meters, taking 14 clicks up as shown in graph 1.1. Keeping the 14 clicks, Raine would place the red dot lower on the 2<sup>nd</sup> target at 100 meters as shown in graph 1.2.

The upper assisting dot can also been used when holding under.


In windy conditions the longest target sight picture is on the target elevation-wise and off only windage-wise, like on Graph 1.3. Aiming easiness in difficult conditions is maximised as much as possible. The thin horizontal lines and red dot act as a guides for positioning of the rifle towards the target.

#### **TECHNIQUE 2**

Holding over, just working with the reticle, no clicks.

Target 1: 150 meters Target 2: 300 meters

In that example the 150 m target would be approached with the center dot as shown in graph 2.1.

The lower dot would work for the second target at 300 m.




Graph 2.1. Target distance 150 m / 0 clicks

These are the two main principles for aiming on targets on different distances in fast rifle shooting.

KAHLES IPSC reticle has the two assisting dots to help fast aiming even in exceptional situations where the two techniques might be combined.










#### **BEYOND DVC**



Without a doubt, nothing since the Second World War has disrupted sporting activities as severely as the 2020 global pandemic. Suddenly shooting ranges shut down, everyone sheltered at home, and it looks like it will be a while before IPSC matches happen with pre-COVID regularity.

It was interesting to see how the IPSC community adapted by taking to the use of social media and videoconference platforms to keep in touch with each other. Dry-fire exercises became a thing, as well as other indoor activities aimed at keeping the shooting skill from becoming perishable. Some were even fortunate to join small level competitions in areas that permitted it. It would seem that a semblance of normalcy was slowly but surely returning to the IPSC aficionado.

It just goes to show that despite the unprecedented situation

we all recently experienced, IPSC is well and alive. The spirit of the resilience runs deep, and it will take more than a virus to keep sportspeople all over from participating in what they enjoy the most.

When the Columbia Conference took place almost 45 years ago, I doubt very much if the founding fathers of IPSC could have imagined that the "combat shooting" sport they invented would grow to what it is today. What arguably started out as a weed of an idea, is now a flourishing garden established in over 100 countries or regions. The secret of IPSC success over the decades is stability, volunteerism and a strong sense of family.

Stability resides in the IPSC Consitution, and IPSC Rules. These documents are what unifies us in our sport. The constitution guarantees the legitimacy of the confederation, while the IPSC Rules sets the goal post to a level that which we all play the game. Taken together constitutes the heart of IPSC. If every member of our sport took the time to read and understand the principles behind these two vital documents, would result in a more dynamic and stable organization.

The Range Officers of both IROA and NROI best exemplify the spirit of volunteerism of our sport. It takes a special breed of men and women to serve long gruelling hours under all weather conditions, to ensure that the game we play is safe and fair.

However, the most vital asset of IPSC are the many thousands of people like you and me, who contribute in one way or the other to the resilience of IPSC. 

## **YOUNG GUNS**



#### How did you first hear about IPSC?

I first heard about IPSC when I started shooting in matches here in the Philippines; IPSC's presence in very big and strong in my country and it was very easy to me to get into the sport.

#### For how long have you been shooting?

I started shooting with air soft when I was 8 years old. Then, I moved to real guns after few months. I have been competing in IPSC shooting for 2 years now.

#### What division do you shoot and why?

I shoot Handgun Open Division because the gun has less recoil compared to the guns in other divisions. Also, with Open Division, you don't have to change the magazine all the time. I only need to shoot and move fast and accurate and I really feel this is the right Division for me.





#### What is the coolest about IPSC shooting?

The coolest thing about IPSC shooting is that you get the opportunity to meet a lot of cool people and it's also exciting to shoot new and different courses of fire in every match.

#### What do your friends and family think about you shooting IPSC?

At first my mom didn't approve of it. She was hesitant that I was too young and it might be dangerous. After several talks, she finally agreed and now she's my biggest fan. My friends thought it was cool and they were amazed at with what I could do, because this sport is not common for young kids like me. I'm just so happy I was able to be part of the responsible gun awareness campaign to be able to share to my family and friends a positive view of this sport.

#### What are the biggest challenges you have when shooting IPSC?

The biggest challenge for me is not missing a day in school. We live in the province and it's like 8-10 hour drive from the big matches in the cities. The usual routine when I'm joining a competition is traveling after school that is on Friday night and to be at the range Saturday morning to shoot; then on Sunday after the match, we have to travel back to be in school Monday morning.









## HOT SHOTS





#### How many years have you been shooting?

Since shooting sports in Greece are not really a tradition, my pistol shooting experience started back in 1994 at an age of 25. Very soon I reached a Master Class level and finished 17th at the 1998 European match, and since have mastered the game in my country for many years in all divisions

have worked as a shooting sports coach for the Greek Shooting Federation, various shooting clubs, and individuals, been actively involved in the shooting sport for the last 20 years.

#### What do you like best about IPSC shooting?

I like the fact that it creates a challenging environment so I can improve my self-control. It also helps me to build a solid, stronger personality with valuable and effective mental skills for everyday



#### How often do you practice at the range?

Actually I don't have a steady practice routine. For the past 15 years I do some shooting wile I am teaching, so this helps me a little to keep my skills on a descent level.

#### What is your match fiream and ammo?

Currently I'm using a Tanfoglio Stock III for Production & Optics Division. For ammo I use whatever is available since in my country we can only use factory ammo, and the law about sport shooting is very strict.

#### How do you prepare for a match?

I do a lot of visualization that helps me a lot to create the conditions to perform at my max.

I work systematically to minimize the possibilities of having mental distractions; I make sure that I do everything I can to have my equipment checked, spare parts etc. so there will be no last minute surprises and if they happen I will already have worked out a solution. In general, I focus only to the things that I can control, and accept those factors that I don't so everything else that's happening out of my controlling area doesn't distract me mentally.

#### Who do you consider your inspiration or mentor?

I never had a personal experience with a mentor. I started learning shooting by myself. I can say that I have been positively influenced by many charismatic people and mostly from Socrates, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Bruce Lee, Rob Leatham.

#### How do you unwind at the end of the day?

I enjoy every moment with my wonderful wife and son, we love to go to the fantastic beaches of my home island Rhodes also we love going for a night walk. I also relax a lot when I am crafting stuff at my workshop, and reading books of my interests.

#### What advice do you have for up and coming shooters?

Learn to enjoy practicing with less effort. The secret is not working hard, is enjoying the work you do.
